To equip learners with eCompetences to engage in eLearning activities.

Provision of Resources

The Curriculum Management and eLearning Department in conjunction with the Department for Student Services purchases software and also hardware to service the needs of special needs students.

Today, at the Primary Level no streaming is being carried out in Years 5 and 6. This reflects the situation in Years 1-4.

End of Primary Benchmark. Assessment of:

- Listening (20 marks)
- Speaking (20 marks)
- Reading Comprehension (30 marks) and
- Writing (30 marks) in Maltese and English
- Mental Paper (20 marks) and Written Paper (80 marks) in Mathematics.

At the Secondary Level, next year, in Form 1 there will not be any streaming.

- There will be setting only in Maltese, English, and Mathematics.
- In Secondary Schools class size is different according to subject and form. At Primary level average is 17+ per class.

There will be a Curriculum which will cater for a number of levels within the same class

In Form 1 these levels will be 1-8 in the case of subjects started at Primary level and levels 1 to 5 in the case of subjects started at Form 1.

End of Secondary School Certificate

Students will be allocated marks for

- Formal
- Non formal (during school hours) and
- Informal educational experiences.
