Setting the scene

Raising Achievements for all learners is a key priority at European level (ET 2020 objectives) as well as at national level (2010 Country Survey: identified as a clear priority for countries for further investigation at European level).

Key Questions:

1 – What does the topic 'Raising Achievements' mean? Which achievements? What is the meaning of 'raising'?
2 – What are the expectations in terms of which learners should be considered?
3 – The policy priorities clearly highlight the topic as a quality issue. What does quality mean?
4 – How can quality and raised achievements be identified?



Setting the scene

Highlighted issues and topics:

- Focus: *all learners* and how we can use effective approaches that work with all learners. *Meaningful participation in the learning environment*, not learners' specific needs.

- Terminology: definitions of 'raising' and 'achievements'

- Raising Achievement as a rights issue: all learners' right to access curriculum

- Raising Achievement as a quality issue: identification of the factors involved in quality education



Setting the scene

Highlighted issues and topics:

- Academic and social aspects of learning: communication and social skills are essential as academic knowledge.

- How learning achievements can be effectively identified: how can progress and achievement of learners be meaningfully measured?

- The role of different actors in raising achievements: raising the expectations of policy makers, teachers, parents and learners themselves



RA4AL project overview

 One-year project (December 2011- November 2012), supported under Commission LLP Comenius Accompanying Measures funding.

- The one-year project will be phase 1 of the Agency RA4AL project.

PROJECT AIM:

To address the need expressed by policy makers for more information on quality education in inclusive settings as a strategy for raising achievement for all learners by identifying:

- the issues that need to be explored

- strategies at the policy level that appear to be successful in raising achievement for all learners in inclusive settings.



RA4AL project overview

RA4AL Conference (Odense, 13-15 June, 2012) with the participation of representatives from 3 key target groups, from 27 European countries:

- Policy makers on general education
- Policy makers on inclusive education
- Researchers in inclusive education



CONFERENCE AIMS

- to explore initiatives and approaches that appear to be successful in improving the quality of education in inclusive settings

- to identify some factors that support the raising achievement of all learners to improve life chances and provide better opportunities for full participation in society

- to raise awareness of the benefits of European co-operation among policy makers and researchers



Expected Outcomes

- A clear rationale in relation to quality education in inclusive settings as a way to raise the achievement for all learners

- A synthesis of relevant information to support recommendations and key policy messages relating to raising achievement for all learners in national and European contexts

(This will be used as the basis for phase 2 work by the Agency in a further thematic project)
